In order to earn PWS Signature status an artist must have been accepted into 2 PWS Juried Exhibitions within an 8 year period and been a continuous PWS member during this time. To maintain Signature status, dues must be kept current each year.

New Sylvan Grouse Guild Member for 2020:

Sylvan Grouse Guild membership is given to a Signature artist by a point system from awards earned in the PWS Juried Exhibitions. An artist must have been a continuous PWS member while earning these points. To maintain Sylvan Grouse Guild status, dues must be kept current each year.

Facts and figures from this year's online juried show

Of the 633 paintings entered, 127 were selected by the Juror Of Selection.

Artists came from 36 states and 11 foreign countries.

Pennsylvania had the most artists entering with 115, followed by Maryland (28), New York (22), Florida (20) and Virginia (18).

Pennsylvania Watercolor Society Second Quarter Treasurer's Report October 1, 2020

Checking Account

We began the second quarter with an actual starting balance of \$56,957.09

Quarterly Income was \$11,639.50 and came primarily from member dues, workshop fees, and juried show entry fees.

<u>Quarterly Expenses</u> were \$2,107.72 due primarily to a Fat Cow renewal, workshop lodging for 2021, juried selection juror, insurance payment and miscellaneous supplies.

Our current checking account balance is \$66,488.87 which is approximate since the September balance has not posted yet.

Saving Account

Our saving account has not changed and remains at \$5.15.

Certificate of Deposit

Our CD's current ending balance is approximately \$8,115.08 (approximate because the September interest has not posted yet).

Our treasury is in good shape as we move into the fourth quarter. The juried show awards and expenses will draw a considerable amount from the checking account, but with the imminent beginning of dues renewal, we will be in excellent shape to move into the new year.

2020 Juried Show

The Pennsylvania Watercolor Society's

41st Annual International Juried Exhibition

Due to Covid-19 the 2020 Juried Show is online. September 26 - November 1, 2020

PWS Juror of Selection Statement:

Thank you to the Pennsylvania Watercolor Society for the invitation to juror the exhibition and to instruct a workshop. I was honored, but it was an arduous job selecting 125 from over 600 submissions. Watercolor can be challenging, so I was impressed at the scope and quality of work. The chosen pieces will provide viewers a great taste of what can be accomplished with the medium.

Everyone probably realizes the process of selection has some subjectivity. That another juror would undoubtedly select some different paintings. And if provided more time to review the entrants, I would have continued to swap one painting for another as there were so many worthy of recognition.

In regards to criteria, many of the paintings have shown strong composition that perhaps leads the eye in or around the painting. interesting and balanced shapes, harmonious or impactful colors, strategic use of values, etc. However, as this is a Watercolor Exhibit, a significant criteria was "Does the painting showcase the qualities of watercolor well?" What makes watercolor so unique and enjoyable (and sometimes challenging) is the medium of water, which helps the artists create the beautiful intermingling of color and unique textures and transparent glazes that are unique to watercolor.

Many of the artists in this exhibit show the qualities unique to watercolor as well as showing great skill in controlling the medium... some to the point of photo-realism.

However, as the artist Herman Pekel once said, "Artists make the worst judges, as they focus on the technical side vs the emotional side of the painting." And added that if Van Gogh would have entered an exhibition, Artists would have never selected his pieces. So, I tried to take this into consideration and not just look at the paintings with a "technical eye", but also simply view the paintings in terms of whether I felt drawn to the painting; does the painting illicit an emotion, does the piece hold my interest?

Lastly, I appreciate risk-taking, originality, and/or a thought-provoking painting or a piece that tells a story or brings me into the scene.

Again, there were many more worthy submissions than there were spots available. Thank you for sharing them and congratulations to the selected artists.
